

FAQ for Pre-AP Summer Math Camp

Q: What will be covered?

A: The curriculum will cover material to help students be more successful as they advance into Pre-AP Math course:

- A 6th grade student going into a Pre-AP 7th grade Math class means the student is going from the 6th grade curriculum into the 8th grade curriculum.
- A regular 7th grade student going into a Pre-AP 8th grade Math means the student is going from the 7th grade curriculum to the 9th grade Algebra 1 curriculum, a high school credit course.

Q: Can I get a copy of the curriculum?

A: No, we are not allowed to release our curriculum, but you can see what objectives or student expectations are taught by going to the TEA website. You will need to read what is listed for the 7th Grade TEKS (Texas Essential Knowledge & Skills) or the 8th grade TEKS if your child is going from regular 7th to Pre-AP 8th (Algebra 1)

Q: My child has camp this summer and will miss some days. Will he/she be removed from the program?

A: No, your child will not be removed from the program, since this is not a credit bearing course. However, they will be missing vital information when they are absent. They can speak to their teacher either before or after they return to get the materials missed.

Q: Can the enrollment fee be adjusted for the time missed?

A: No, the money taken in at registration helps take care of materials, teachers, administrators and buses for the entire session.

Q: Will there be scholarships available?

A: Yes, see your counselor for criteria for qualification.

Q: Will there be transportation?

A: Yes, we will have buses running from most junior highs and possibly a few elementary schools. We will have that information available by June 1st at Pre-registration.

Q: How will I know the progress of my student?

A: Students are given a Pre test and Post test. The results of the progress that students make during the course will be sent home on the last day. If your student is not there to take home the Progress Report, it will be mailed to you. Students will also have weekly take-home folders, so you can see what work is done in class.

Q: Will homework be assigned?

A: No, because of the time and structure in class, students will not be assigned homework.
